
Clinical Instructor for Outpatient OT Services, specializing in complex fractures, burns, amputations, arthritis, and other upper limb orthopedic conditions.



This League is an all-volunteer, 501© (3) nonprofit organization that puts caring and commitment into action through philanthropic programs and hands-on involvement. The Laguna Beach chapter, initially called Las Amigas, began in 1952 with 14 women who had a philanthropic vision, and was chartered in 1962, and became the 19th chapter of National Assistance League. They now have 160 member volunteers working to make Laguna Beach and surrounding communities better places to live and work.
